ANNE PERRY Keynote Speaker

New York Times and international bestselling author Anne Perry is noted for her memorable characters and exploration of social and ethical issues. Two of her series—one featuring Thomas Pitt, one featuring William Monk—have been published worldwide. She has a third successful five-book series based around World War I. Among her other novels is the Byzantium novel The Sheen on the Silk, and fantasies that reflect her spiritual convictions: Tathea and Come Armageddon. Anne has published over eighty-five novels, more than 28 million in print. None of her titles has ever been out of print.

The Times, as listed in Mystery Page Turners, selected her as one of the 20th Century's "100 Masters of Crime." In 2015 she was awarded the Premio de Honor Aragón Negro.

Her first series of Victorian crime novels, featuring Thomas and Charlotte Pitt, began with *The Cater Street Hangman*. The latest of these, *Murder on the Serpentine*, was released on March 21, 2017.

In 1990, Anne started a second series of detective novels with *The Face of a Stranger*. These are set about 35 years before the Pitt series, and feature the private detective William Monk and volatile nurse Hester Latterly. The most recent of these (23rd in the series) is *An Echo of Murder* (forthcoming in 2017).

Anne won an Edgar award in 2000 with her short story "Heroes". The main character in the story features in an ambitious five-book series set during World War I.
